Marion and I just returned from a two week vacation in Cozumel, Mexico. We've visited there four times over the past 20 or so years. It is a wonderful place with sun and surf and snorkeling and shopping. It is a place where we have built lots of memories and it is a place where we've always found the renewal of connection. It is a place and time for us to intentionally be in touch with one another, to take stock of where we are and where we want to be . . . with each other.

William James wrote, "Our lives are like islands in the sea, or trees in the forest, which co-mingle their roots underground. Just so, there is a continuum of cosmic consciousness, against which our individuality builds accidental fences, and into which our several minds plunge as into a mother sea or reservoir."

Madeleine L'Engle added to that idea in her book, *Walking on Water*, "The creator is not afraid to leap over the 'accidental fences' and then plunge into the deep waters of creation. There, once again, and in another way, we lose ourselves to find ourselves."

There are times in which we find ourselves directed by something toward places we otherwise would not go. Lent was a time in which that is likely to happen. As we journeyed to Jerusalem with Jesus, we found that there is something giving us direction. We were being asked to lower our fences and to check out boundaries. We were asked to examine our motives and think about the consequences of the things we do and the things we have refrained from doing. After Easter, there is still something being asked of us. It isn't demanded and it isn't required. It doesn't insist and yet it motivates. We can ignore it or we can let it take us where it will.

Recently, I read about a concert performed by a university orchestra and a guest violinist. The orchestra was wonderful. The music was inspiring. However, the guest violinist opened a very dramatic piece with the first four notes from his instrument by playing the wrong notes. The opening theme was repeated several times during the piece and on all the other occasions he was exactly right. He just missed the first four notes.

What is to be admired about what happened is the violinist simply continued playing and he worked his way out of his problem. There might have been a desire to stop and apologize; but he just kept going. The director could

May 2010 Greeting Continued

Stopped the Orchestra and allowed the musician to repair his gaff, but he let the band play on. What drove the orchestra, the conductor, and the violinist was the music itself and they were all in it together. There was an imperative to continue which must have been difficult when the first four notes were played in error.

In life, especially *in life in relationships*, there are moments of disappointment. We are apt to let ourselves and each other down. We could find ourselves playing the wrong notes. We might think it is best to quit but there will be an imperative to keep going. Easter calls us to be driven by our faith to press forward into the relationships that fill our lives, at home, in the household of faith, in the community.

During the course of the next several weeks our worship themes will be centered on our relationships, specifically our relationships with our spouses and significant others. Matt and I will be referring to Gary Chapman's book, *The 5 Love Languages: The Secret to Love That Lasts*. On April 25, the theme will be What Happens to Love *After* the Wedding? On May 2, Keeping Our Tanks Full. On May 9, we will begin our successive examinations of Chapman's five love languages: Words of Affirmation, Quality Time, Receiving Gifts, Acts of Service, and Physical Touch. The series will have eight parts scheduled around church celebrations and observances.

Robert Frost was asked by a group of students, "Does the universe have a purpose?" His answer was interesting. He looked at the students and asked, "Are you capable of having a purpose?" and then he said to them, "Could it be that the purpose of the universe is that each of us find our purpose?"

Can we find our purpose? Could it be, as theologian Karl Barth said, "The purpose of Creation *is* relationship?"

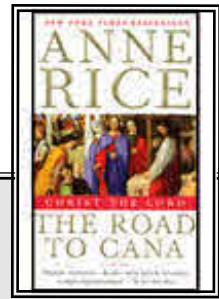

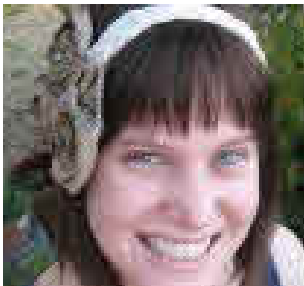

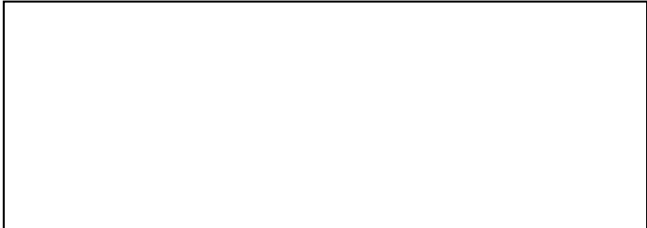
