As you can imagine, he has been extremely busy getting to know not just our congregation, but also all of the ins and outs of how Vista functions. A native of Kokomo, Indiana, Pastor Dave earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Ball State University. After 5-1/2 years in local government as assistant to the mayor and Director of Community Development in Kokomo, he moved to Evanston, Illinois. There he earned a Master of Divinity from Garrett-Evangelical and won the Faust Preaching Award. Later he received a Doctor of Ministry degree from Drew University where he was honored as guest preacher at the doctoral chapel service.

Following seminary, Dave and his wife Norma moved to Nebraska to serve in that conference. After 21 years there, the Pattersons moved to Arizona where Dave served as pastor of Scottsdale UMC before being transferred to Vista. His wife is Vice President of Academic Affairs at Argosy University in Phoenix. The Pattersons have three grown children.

As an avid outdoorsman, Dave has hiked extensively and is looking forward to exploring the trails in the Tucson area. One of his greatest outdoor achievements was canoeing the entire 450 mile length of the Erie Canal! ## FROM PASTOR DAVE:

I have always felt that one of the strangest features of professional team sports is the mid-season trade deadline, a high-stakes version of musical chairs in which players and fans alike are called upon, in the span of a few days or hours, to switch allegiances and move forward as if nothing had changed. The ease or difficulty of the transition depends upon a number of factors, but the experience is usually bittersweet for all involved.

The appointment process in the United Methodist Church is a slow-motion version of this, made all the more complex by the deeper emotional involvement and spiritual needs of both clergy and laity. Regardless of how often one is "traded," it doesn't get any easier; in my experience, quite the opposite. But as Tom Hanks' character says in *A League of Their Own*, "There's no crying in baseball." And in a system that predates baseball by a couple of generations, there's not much point in crying about the appointment process either.

Clear and open communication would help make transitions smoother, but ultimately a successful realignment requires parties to focus their energies on the task at hand, be it winning baseball games or winning souls for Christ.

As we approach the "busy season" of the church, and engage our minds and hearts in the work Christ has given us to do, let us create a sense of teamwork here at Vista that maximizes the talents and gifts God has given us, that we might declare with the enthusiasm of the Apostle Paul, "...this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

With the blessings that we enjoy, it is sometimes hard to believe that right here in our community there are little children who are in need of the basic food necessities, but such is the case. **We are looking for a new Leader** for this project, as our current Leader, Nedra Thomason, is planning to move to San Diego in December. Many of you have read the article on Friday Aug.12th, in the *Arizona Daily Star* that the Department of Juvenile Corrections for the State of Arizona is closing Catalina Mountain School on Oct. 1st. The present juvenile detainees will be moved to one of two facilities that are in the Phoenix area. This is a cost saving measure for DJC and will lead to a significant cost saving for the taxpayers too. Vista’s Outreach Ministry has been active for 4 years in visiting and ministering to these young teenage boys, just down Oracle Road from Vista Church. There have been so many good folks at Vista who have given faithfully of their time and care to this Ministry. It is our deepest hope that seeds of faith and goodness have been planted in the hearts and souls of these troubled youth that will help lead them to make much better decisions for their lives in the future. We pray God’s blessing on them and may they carry in their hearts the knowledge that the people of Vista Church cared for them and God cares even much more. Only time will tell what the harvest of our efforts will be, but we ask God’s blessing on the efforts we have made in our time with them. There are a good number of faithful folks to thank for their participation in this ministry, but I especially want to thank John & Carol Witt for the dedicated leadership they have provided to us all in this challenging Ministry. This week a number of us, as well as Vista de la Montana Church, were awarded “Outstanding Community Partner Award” certificates for our work in the Epiphany Youth Retreat at CMS. We were pleased to receive the recognition and the Award will be posted in the narthex for you to see in the near future. Again, many thanks to all you good folks who shared in this Ministry.
